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	the Grizzly and Cub yesterday where we had almost half of the club members crossing the finish line. Several HRC runners took on the East Devon Round Half with several signing up to run the whole thing this year.	
	Further afield, we had a few runners in 2023's London Marathon and others taking part in races overseas.	
	As well as the EDR, several members took part in ultra events and this included the localish Ham to Lyme 31 miler.	
	The club trip to Salisbury was enjoyed by all (well maybe not Esme). This was very popular although I'm not sure we will be returning. At least the weather was good, enough said about their organisation! The organisation for HRC was excellent – thanks Paula.	
	We had some great social events including a butty run, a bbq and lots of pub runs.	
	Training sessions and club runs on Mondays and Wednesdays seemed to be well received and a huge thanks to everyone who organised a session or led a group at all. I'm in the process of organising runs for the next 3 months so please feel free to let me know if you can help organise a session.	
	Can I just remind everyone who races to drop me an email, preferably with a photo so that I can send it to the press. If you want to write the actual report, even better! If you don't tell me about it, I probably won't know about it!	
	Well done to everyone who has raced wearing club colours during 2023. You all did us proud!"	
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	Alasdair talked about Arranging Summer runs e.g. East Hill strips and that they are keen to close the gap with the older side (adults) and younger side of the club. He reported the following results from the Grizzly weekend: Grizfest -8 out of top 20 were from Honiton Juniors. 1st up was the Junior Grizzly for ages 11 to 15 with a 4km course, with Imogen Clarke who 3rd girl overall and 5 Honiton runners in the top 10 and 8 in the top 20. (Aubrey Green 5th, George Hair 6 h, Yossi Maclure 7th, Hamish McKechnie 9th and Rafi Maclure 10 <sup>th</sup> .) Aubrey and George were both 2nd in their respective age categories M15 and M13.Continuing the strong performances were Sam Twaddle in 12th, Oli Triner in 17th and Tommy Wright in 18th . Imogen Clarke was 23rd overall, but notably 3rd overall and 2 <sup>nd</sup> in her age category. Faber Green was 27th with Emily Pepper coming in 3rd in her age category, 9th girl and 33rd overall.
